- Existing Lawn cemetery grave areas in current use.

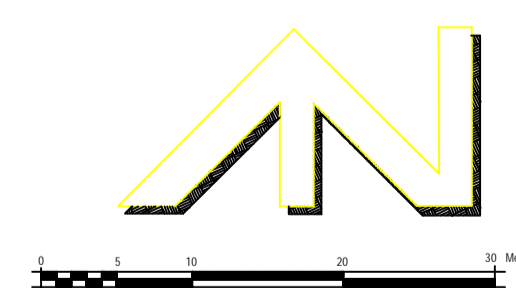
Proposed features

- Deep Subsoil drainage indicated thus to protect pavement, and prevent water travelling to Section 1. Add more as needed to enable grave digging without slumping.
- Proposed on street angle and parallel parking indicated thus. Number of spaces able to be accommodated are notated.
- Pathways, generally along on-street parking areas to Section entries.
- Buildings and structures, namely Gazebo / shelter in Section 3 - medium term.
- Proposed Lawn Cemetery style burial areas indicated thus: Single accessway per two rows.
- Tree planting indicated thus
- Mass shrub planting in mulched plant beds indicated thus.
