SUMMARY:

Reporting on the appointment of Local and Unit Controllers for the State Emergency Service.



Under the State Emergency Service Regulation 2001, a Controller is to be appointed for a term not exceeding 2 years but is eligible for reappointment.

Peter Floyd, the Division Controller for Oxley division of the State Emergency Services is seeking Council's concurrence to the reappointment of Mrs May Gill as the Local Controller of the Kempsey State Emergency Service and Mr Warren Hancock as the Unit controller for Gladstone.
