SUMMARY:

Reporting on proposals for naming of a road.



A request has been received to name an unnamed road 8.7Kms along Maria River Road "Nevertire Road". A map of the proposed road is attached at [Appendix A](#)

This dedicated road was the former main access road to Point Plomer, Big Hill and Racecourse Headland and provided access to Millicent and Ernest Baker's property called "Nevertire" Maria River. Mrs Millicent Baker was instrumental in having this road dedicated.

The Macleay Historical Society have no objections to the proposed Road name. Also no objections were received from the landowners along this Road.

The proposed Road name has been advertised in both the Happenings and the Argus with no objection received.

REPORT IMPLICATIONS:

- *Environmental*

Nil.

- *Social*

Naming of roads is required to assist residents in locating properties and addresses.

- *Economic (Financial)*

There is a minimal cost for the supply and erection of the sign.

- *Policy or Statutory*

Under the Roads Act 1993, Sect 10, Division 4, Clause 162, a roads authority may name all public roads for which it is the roads authority and must give the Geographical Names Board at least one month's notice of the proposed name. Local roads or streets fall under the jurisdiction of the local council that administers the area.

The Roads (General) Regulation 2000 requires the authority to:

- "4. Publish notice of its proposal in a local newspaper and*
- 5 Serve notice of its proposal on Australia Post, the Registrar General and the Surveyor General."*

The proposed names comply with Council's Policy C 22:6 Street Naming.

- *Director's Review*

Council is asked to adopt the recommendations.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the dedicated road 8.7km along Maria River Road be named 'Nevertire Road'.
