Local Oyster Farmers Clean up the Macleay River



Last week local oyster farmers participated in a clean up of the Macleay River as a part of their annual Tide to Tip event to ensure that our local river system remains healthy.

Our oyster farmers have a close relationship with their local environment. Oyster farmers have an intimate knowledge of their local environment and regularly collect the rubbish that is found floating in the estuary. Thanks to their diligence, the river is a cleaner place for marine life to thrive.

Strengthening Business Service

Strengthening Business Service is a free service that assists bushfire affected businesses to recover, grow and become more resilient, recognising that many businesses have also been devastated by COVID-19 and the 2021 flood event. Businesses should be eligible for this service if they were engaged in business with an ABN during the bushfires (1 Aug 19 - 29 Feb 20) and were impacted either directly or indirectly by the fires.

If eligible, a Strengthening Business facilitator will work with you to create and help implement a roadmap

for your business going forward.

Apply for the Small Business Fees and Charges Rebate

If you're a sole trader, the owner of a small business or a not-for-profit organisation in NSW, you may be

eligible for a small business fees and charges rebate of \$2,000.

This rebate helps businesses recover from the impacts of COVID-19 and encourages growth by reducing

the cost of running a business. Eligible businesses or not-for-profits only need to apply for the rebate once,

but can submit multiple claims until the full value of \$2,000 is reached.

Funds can be used to offset the costs of eligible NSW and local government fees and charges due and

paid from 1 March 2021. These include, but are not limited to:

food authority licences

• liquor licences

tradesperson licences

event fees

outdoor seating fees

council rates

road user tolls for business use.
