

Grants and Funding

<u>New Business Assistance with NEIS</u> - This program aims to provide personalised support to help individuals become a self-employed business owner. A total of 8,600 places available nationally each year, delivered by a network of NEIS providers.

<u>Skilling Australians Fund</u> - This program aims to support the training of apprentices and trainees to help employers gain skilled workers to drive innovation and growth. Eligible projects include those that support training in occupations in high demand that currently rely on skilled migration, future growth industries, and in rural and regional areas.

<u>Jobactive Wage Subsidy</u> - This program aims to encourage employers to hire eligible participants in ongoing jobs by contributing to the initial costs of hiring a new employee. It seeks to help in building a business and give employers greater flexibility in their hiring options. Eligible businesses can receive payments over a six month period from employment services providers.

<u>NSW Regional Business Event Development Fund</u> - Designed to help stakeholders create, attract and support exciting business events for regional NSW and to support new business event initiatives. An Applicant may apply for funding based on the following scale:

• Up to \$15,000 (ex GST) for a business event with up to 150 delegates (projected attendance)

• Up to \$30,000 (ex GST) for a business event with over 150 delegates (projected attendance)

Applications opened on Tuesday 2 November 2021 and are assessed on a first come, first served basis until the funds are expended.


