Severe Storm and Flood Assistance

The impact of severe storms and flood can affect primary producers beyond their own resilience levels, requiring assistance to recover personally and financially.

DPI and the Agricultural and Animal Services Functional Area coordinate and provide recovery assistance and advice to landholders and primary producers including commercial fishers, aquaculturists, foresters and other industries impacted by a natural disaster event.

Operation Property Clean Up

Residents in the Kempsey Shire whose properties were affected by the 2019-20 bushfire season and are yet to dispose of fire-affected fencing materials or need help clearing, felling or disposing of fallen trees on their property could be eligible for a free clean up.

Operation Property Clean Up is a joint program between Kempsey Shire Council and Disaster Relief Australia.

The program will see professional contractors embark on a clean-up from April 2022.
